
TRANSITIONING FROM ABA TO SCHOOL Tips for transitioning your child to school





CHOOSE A SCHOOL

- Research different schools
- Request to tour the school
- If your desired school is outside your neighborhood, request a transfer during the district's transfer period, or fill out an application if it's a private school



REQUEST A SPECIAL EDUCATION EVALUATION

- Request this through email
- You can ask for a Functional Behavior Analysis (FBA) if appropriate
- You can also ask for OT and Speech evaluations as well



PREPARE FOR THE IEP MEETING

- Individualized Education Program (IEP)
- Make a list of your child's strengths
- Make a list of your concerns
- Make a list of your goals for your child
- Request a meeting to discuss services and supports prior to their first day

SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S TRANSITION

- Tour the school & classroom with your child
- Request pictures of the school, classroom
 & teachers to make a social story for your child if appropriate
- Request someone to observe your child at Cornerstone - this can be the special education teacher or school psychologist.



OVER-COMMUNICATE

- Set out your expectations clearly
- Keep in contact if you don't hear back
- Keep all parties involved up-to-date
- Ask a lot of questions
- Communicate your concerns
