



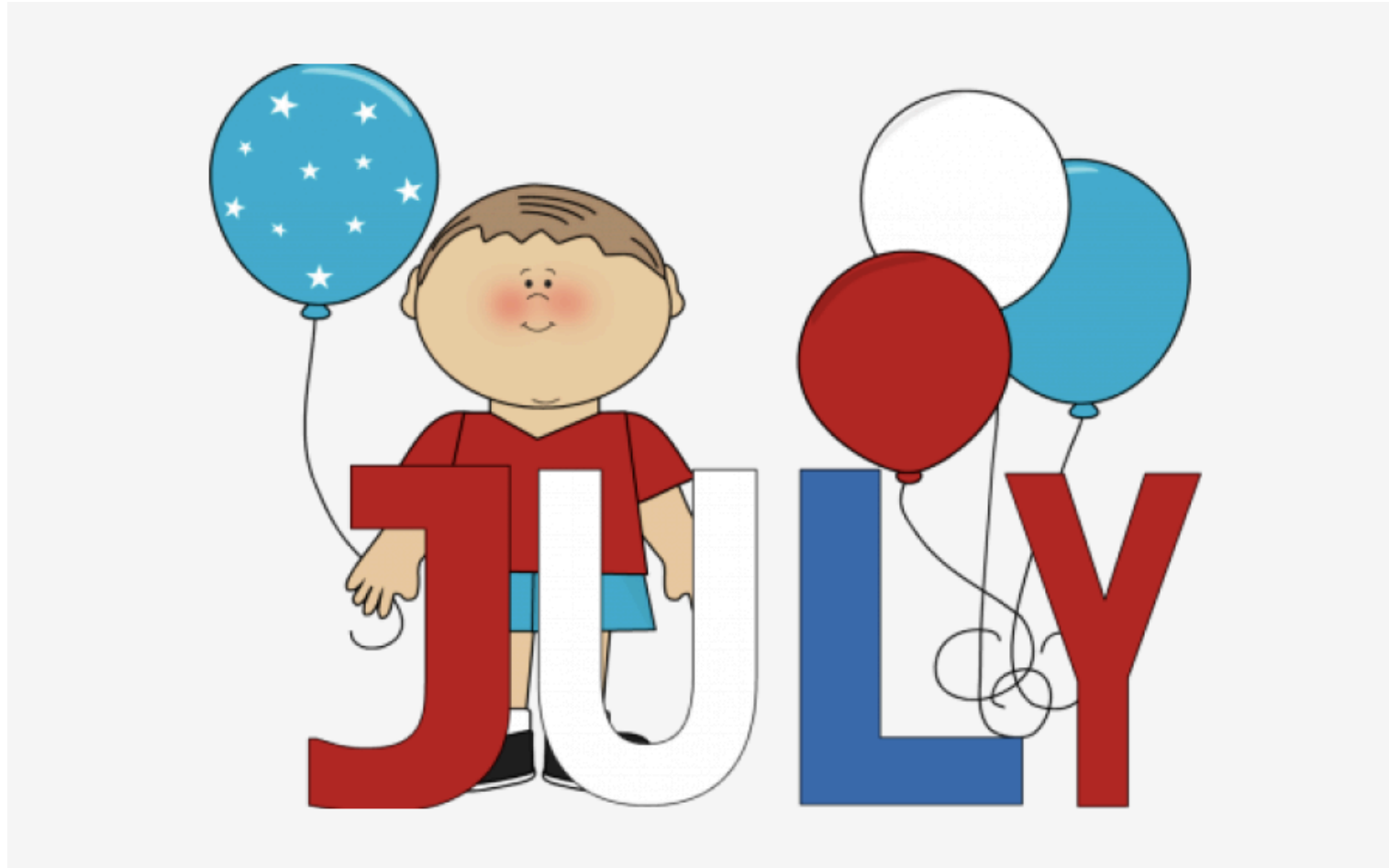

On the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, I get to see my family and friends.



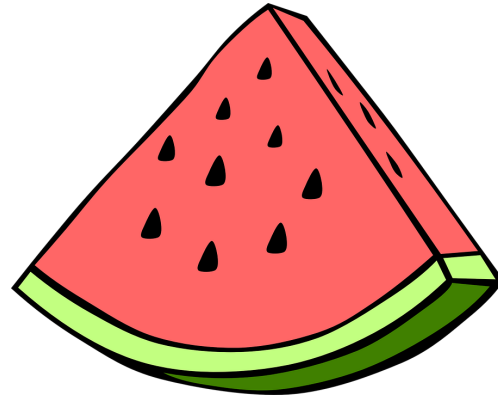
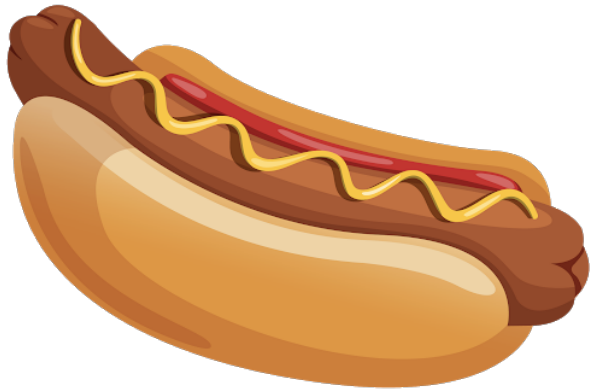
I love my friends and family, but sometimes I need to be by myself.



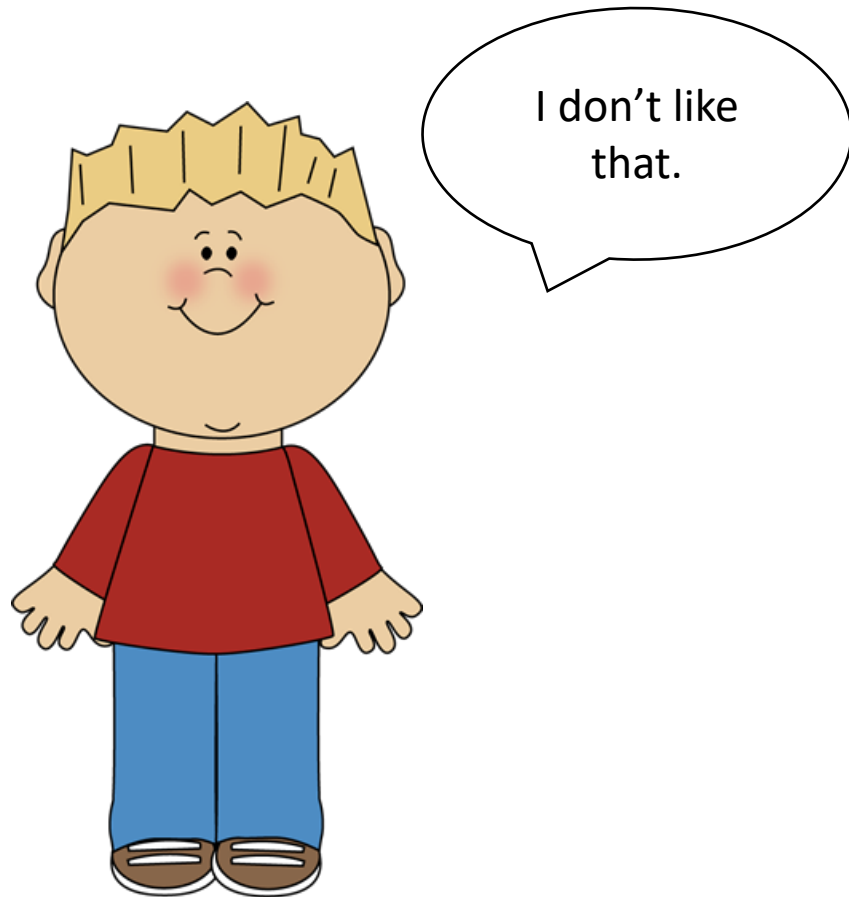
If I need time to myself, I can tell my parents “break” and they will take me to a quiet room to relax.
